Transition Task Health and Social Care 2021

Transition tasks provide students with an introduction to studying BTEC Health & Social Care. The tasks aim to:

- Develop your knowledge of the foundations of the subject and use of specialist vocabulary
- Review prior learning

Transition work also helps your teacher to assess the following academic skills:

- Use of sources of information (read, understand, pick out relevant information)
- Writing (structure, sequencing and fluency of work; spelling, punctuation and grammar; ability to write critically and form a justified conclusion)

It is important to take your time and do your best.

Task:

1. Produce a written account (2 sides) to compare how two lifestyle factors affect health and wellbeing. Use at least three sources of research to,
 - identify similarities and differences of the impact on health and wellbeing of each factor
 - draw valid conclusions to evaluate the potential long term impact to health and wellbeing and to the NHS of each factor
